August 15, 2025 – The Embassy of India in Juba celebrated the 79th Independence Day of India with a ceremony attended by members of the Indian community, Indian peacekeepers from the United Nations Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS), representatives from ONGC Videsh, members of the media, and friends of India. The celebration began with the Ambassador of India to South Sudan Anil Nautiyal, hoisting the national flag, the Tiranga, followed by the singing of the Indian national anthem. The Indian peacekeepers at the UNMISS gave a salute to the Tiranga. Excerpts from the address of the Honorable President of India to the nation were read by the Ambassador, which highlighted India's achievements and vision for the future. The Ambassador also took the opportunity to reflect on the past year, detailing the significant work and initiatives undertaken by the Embassy to strengthen bilateral relations and support the Indian diaspora in South Sudan. The event also featured a cultural performance, with a captivating Bharatnatyam dance by Lt Col Hemlatha from UNMISS. The celebration concluded with attendees mingling and sharing in the festive spirit of the occasion.

Food packets, stationery and grocery items were donated to the Orphanage.

August 21, 2025 – The Ambassador attended a veterinary camp in Bor, Jonglei State, organized by Indian peacekeepers of INDBATT-II serving with the United Nations Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS). The Camp provided essential medical care to around 1800 animals, a critical source of livelihood for local communities. The event was also attended by the State Livestock Minister, Country Commissioner, other senior officials of the region, including the UNMISS Force Commander and the Senior National Representative of India, who all underscored the importance of such humanitarian efforts in promoting peace and stability. The Ambassador in his address emphasized the new growing ties & cooperation between the two countries. The Government of India is providing financial support for the above Camps for the last few years. The vet medicines are also from India. During his visit, the Ambassador of India also met with and addressed the Commander & All ranks of INDBATT-II serving with the United Nations Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS). The Ambassador praised them for their exemplary service, valor, and unwavering dedication to global peace.

## CIMIC ACTIVITIES BY DMI SISTERS

### **DMI sisters' engagement in uplifting the vulnerable South Sudanese**

During the this quarter (July to September -2025), DMI sisters with the support of a professional team organized various programs for the targeted populations in three states namely central Equatoria , Upper Nile and Warrap.

- 1,180 HHs (IPC3 &4) supported with family food ration for three months of lean season
- 150 Returnees' households were supported with safe and secure living by constructing the temporary shelters
- Supported 3,385 children in 6 DMI schools with teaching and learning , sports materials and basic furniture
- Supported one community school with inclusive toilet stances and three safe class rooms
- Vocational skill trainings organized for 101 youths on four types of trades – Tailoring, beautician, plumbing & electrical
- Short time skills training organized for 220 youths and women on beads making , sandal making , embroidery and soap making
- Constructed 8 flood prevention structures, 23 small level crossing bridges over water channels and cleared 15 km road through cash for work program
- 1,475 women supported through VSLA (village saving & loan association) methodology for their socio economic promotion
- 380 GBV (gender based violence ) survivors were supported with counselling and related service for overcoming their trauma and moving towards self-reliance



## CIMIC ACTIVITIES OF INDIAN PEACE-KEEPERS IN UNMISS

**1.1. TTX on Counter CRSV.** From 28th June to 1st July 2025, Maj Swathi S, Engagement Team Cdr of INDBATT-1 participated in the TTX along with representatives from all sectors, MLO, WPAU and 2 delegation from the UNHQ, New York. The discussion was on the meaning of CRSV, its impact and important actions taken by peacekeepers to

prevent & reduce it in South Sudan.





**1.2. Interaction with County leadership and Women for empowerment project in Melut County.** The Chairman Civil Society, Mr Kujwow Pauimo Awino and the Women leadership were engaged with to identify projects for empowering the community and women. A tailoring institute was identified to be built and set up by Mar 2026.



**1.3. Interaction with FGPT.** On 4th Sep 2025, the FGPT rep Maj Mouiz interacted with the engagement team consisting of women & men soldiers. She enlightened them on meaning of & the importance of reporting sexual exploitation & abuse.



**1.4. Quiz and Awareness Drive in Kudok.** Major Swathi and Major Swapnil led an engaging Awareness Drive in Kudok with the objective of educating and motivating young students. The session included interactive discussions on key issues relevant to children's growth and well-being, creating a platform for knowledge sharing in a simple and relatable manner.





**1.5. Coordination meeting with Gender Focal Point.** On 19 Sep 25, the sector GFP conducted a meeting to coordinate future patrols and engagements.



**1.6. Coordination with Fishery Dept.** On 17 Sep 2025, a meeting was conducted to coordinate for the execution of QIP project with the Dept of Fishery. Lt Col Raghav, Maj Swathi and Capt Valarie participated in the discussions with the director of the Ministry of Animal and Fishery.

**1.7. Distribution of Essentials in Women Union.** On 22 Sep, The team conducted a patrol to the Malakal Town and engaged with acting head of women union and handed over essential sanitary items for women.



**1.8. Workshop for Joint Operations Forces.** On 25 Sep, a workshop was conducted along with the child protection unit, HR and PIO for the security forces of Malakal, Attended by SSPDF & SSNPS.





**1.9. Stationary for Women.** On 29 Sep 25, the team interacted with the local and handed over stationary for children. Stationery items were handed over for the children to support their education and encourage regular school attendance.



**1.10. Yoga camp in Schools.** INDBATT-1 conducted Yoga camp in schools for children to improve their physical and mental health.



### **1.11. Professional Veterinary Aid**

**1.11.1 Veterinary camps in Upper Nile State.** A Mobile Veterinary Clinic continues to operate at Malakal, supporting the Ministry of Animal Resources, Upper Nile State, and treating approximately 4000 animals benefitting more than 170 households over the quarter.

**1.11.2** A joint veterinary outreach was with combined resources of both contingents of Indian Army was organized for the needy pastoralist community of locals in Tiber, Bor in Jonglei state. As witnessed by national dignitaries the camp provided care to around 1750 animals, earning appreciation from local authorities and pastoral communities.

**1.12. Key Leadership Engagement (KLE) with County Commissioners at Malakal Town.** As representative of TCCs/ Indian Contingent from UNMISS Lt Col Raghav Sharma participated in Second County Commissioners' Forum in Malakal from 04 Sep 2025 to 06 Sep 2025 where interaction with local leaderships viz County Commissioners of all Counties of Upper Nile State, ministers and Hon'ble Governor of Upper Nile State was carried out.

## CIMICS ACTIVITIES OF INDBAT-II, UNMISS (JUL-SEP2025)

INDBATT-II is deployed in Jonglei State and Greater Pibor Administrative Area in South Sudan since Mar 2025. Various Civic Activities during Jul to Sep 2025 are as under:-

**1. Community Resilience and Capacity Building through training of Community Animal Health Workers (CAHWs):** INDBATT-II has conducted three specialized Veterinary Training Courses of One week duration for CAHWs on "Basic Livestock Disease Management, Treatment and Zoonosis" across Bor and Akobo Counties of Jonglei State during Jul to Sep 2025. They trained more than hundred CAHWs, including 41 women CAHWs on disease diagnosis, basic treatment, vaccination, prevention and diseases control techniques.

### 2. Veterinary Assistance

**2.1 Veterinary Aid Camps:** Successfully conducted Veterinary Aid Camps in remote and underserved areas of Bor & Akobo Counties of Jonglei State on 21 Aug 2025 and 17 Sep 2025 respectively.

**2.2 Vet Cover at Veterinary Hospital Bor town:** In addition to field outreach Indian peacekeepers from INDBATT- II has also provided advanced veterinary care including life-saving surgeries and treatment of critically sick animals at Veterinary Hospital in Bor Town throughout the year, thereby ensuring good health of precious livestock.

**2.3 Mobile Veterinary Cover during Short duration and Long duration Patrols of UNMISS peace keeping Operations:** Veterinary Cover was also provided during Short and Long duration patrols of UNMISS to remote and most disturbed areas.
